Dr. Shelia Andrews is a researcher at the Center for Leadership Studies, one of the world's leading executive education institutions. She conducts grant-funded studies and manages a program of research focused on understanding the impact of gender stereotypes on leadership evaluations.

Dr. Andrews is widely recognized as a research scholar. She has published 100+ articles in peer-reviewed journals, presented 150+ papers at professional conferences, and won 15 awards for the impact her research has had on the field of industrial/organizational psychology as well as on leaders who work in both the private and public sectors.

Having established herself as an authority in the leadership field, Dr. Andrews was selected to be Editor-in-Chief of The Journal of Leadership, a top-ranked academic publication. She has also served as Editor-in-Chief for three additional journals: Journal of Psychology Practice, Management Quarterly, and Journal of Occupational Leadership.

Dr. Andrews is a Distinguished Fellow of the Society for Industrial/Organizational Psychology and the American Psychological Association. She is a frequently sought-after speaker and has discussed her research in media appearances on CNN, MSNBC, and Fox News.

Before joining the Center for Leadership Studies, Dr. Andrews was a tenured faculty member at the University of North Carolina-Pinetops. She also held positions as Lecturer at the University of Wisconsin-Hobgood and Rocky Mount University.

Dr. Andrews earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology, an MBA (management concentration), and a Ph.D. in leadership studies from Southern Baptist College.
